Dear Colleague:

Your input is needed for the development of the Oswego County Multi-Jurisdictional, Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Risks facing the county include severe storms, including severe thunderstorms and high winds, ice storms, severe winter storms (such as lake effect snow), and flooding. A county-wide mitigation planning team has been assessing these risks and suggesting ways to reduce the vulnerability of people and property to the impacts of disasters occurring within the county.

Oswego County is funding this project to meet the requirements of the federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 through a Pre-Disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant Program grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Barton & Loguidice, P.C. has been developing the plan with representatives of 31 municipalities and several county agencies.
